

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

GLORIOUS GLENHEST - MEMORIES OF A COMMUNITY

The Beltra Story Beltra Salmon lured by Taoiseach's bait

"It provides the best tonic possible in helping to forget temporarily the cares of office," was how former Irish Prime Minister, Seán Lemass, described the World-famed Beltra Lake, near Newport, where he spent an angling week-end back in May, 1961.

he genial premier, who was enjoying a break at the exclusive Newport House Hotel, with friends Toddy O'Sullivan, Manager of the Gresham Hotel, Dublin, and Dublin merchant, John Hanlon, was angling guest of Millionaire Restaurateur, Charles Forte who had just purchased the West side of the picturesque lake.

The Dublin party was hosted by Newport garageman, Mick Kelly, who had "chaperoned" several V.1.P's like British Prime Minister, Clement Atlee, World renowned Irish Tenor, Count John McCormack, Diplomats and Irish Government Ministers, on similar angling trips on the lake.

But, despite the best efforts of Mick Kelly, who guided the Taoiseach to all the "sure spots" on the lake, the elusive salmon failed to rise for the Premier and it looked like Mr. Lemass would have to return to the Capital disappointed at not having landed his first salmon.

After attending Mass in Newport Parish Church on Sunday morning, unnoticed by most of the Parishioners, or any of the 'Party Faithful"— the reason for his get-away trips to Newport House - the Prime Minister, not a man to be known to back from a challenge decided to have another battle with the Silver Kings lurking in Beltra.

Having got word on the grapevine that the Taoiseach had returned to the prestigious lake for a final effort and that the angling party would be coming ashore for refreshments at 2 p.m., I travelled to Beltra in anticipation of recording an historic story.

On arrival at the lakeside, with not a sign of security for miles, Tommy Crofton, sporting his unmistakable straw hat, was in the course of making tea in a black teapot on a turf fire. "You're just in time, they're on their way in," he told me as he opened the picnic basket supplied by the hotel.

After boatman, Paddy Keane, had guided the fishing party ashore for a welcome cuppa, Tommy Crofton informed Mr. Lemass gentleman from the Press to meet you Taoiseach," as he poured the first cup for the Prime Minister, who quipped to Toddy O'Sullivan, " you would not get as good a cup of tea in the Gresham."

And, as we all sat down on the bank to join in the tea-break, Tommy recalled the days in the 1940,s of my Dance Band, The Twilight Serenaders, playing for dances in Glenhest Hall. The Taoiseach was surprised to hear that Tommy was one of the best dancers at the popular venue during that period.

"I would be fine, until ye played "In the Mood" for that new Jitterbug dance, which I could not master" said Tommy.

Helping the pipe-smoking Taoiseach in to his waders after the tea-break I asked him for his first impressions of his battle with the big'uns in Beltra. "Its the best tonic possible in helping to forget temporarily the cares of office and I am charmed with the countryside," he told me.

When it was time to return to the fishing grounds it was decided to change the fly on the Taoiseach's fishing rod and to give a Connemara Black a trial.

But at 4 p.m. the fish had failed to oblige, even for a Prime Minister, and it was begin-ning to look as if Mr. Lemass would only have a "one that got away" story to tell his Cabinet colleagues and veteran ang-lers in the Dáil bar after returning to the City.

Then his line tightened — the Taoiseach was "stuck" in his first salmon.

After 20 minutes play, during which, instructions were coming from Mick Kelly and from other boats which came alongside, the excited Prime Minister had a ten pounder in the boat - the Connemara Black had saved the day.

Judging by the smile on his face, his first big kill brought him more satisfaction than winning an Election.

Later that evening the salmon was on display, as was the custom, in the foyer of Newport House Hotel, where it attracted much attention and debate. And the champagne corks were popping in the Hotel bar to celebrate the occasion.

Having enjoyed my conversation with the approachable Taoiseach in the serene lakeside surroundings, it had a subsequent irony for me. Two weeks later I was walking past the gates of Leinster House in Dublin and noticed a number of people gathered there. I asked a burly Garda on duty there, what was happening. "The Taoiseach is due to arrive any minute, move on please," he answered. My mind immediately switched to a different scene at Beltra and I thought to myself, so much for BUREAUCRACY.
